From The Pastor



The other day I was splitting some firewood and I was reminded of my childhood. In our house we had a fireplace and my dad, my brothers, my uncle, and myself would go out and cut trees to burn. We would load the wood on a truck or trailer and take it back to the house. Then more work would ensure as the wood had to be unloaded and the big stuff had to be split. I remember my dad swinging the ax and sometimes hitting oak that did not want to give up the ghost and he would say, "oh boy." He would continue swinging with deadly accuracy until there was a sound that I do not know how to articulate but if you have ever split firewood you may understand what I am trying to say – a pop. When the "pop" happened my dad would say, "oh yeah." The sound meant that the wood was splitting. The sound would cause the adrenaline to flow and the splitting would continue.

The other day I was splitting firewood and I heard the pop of the oak I was working on and I was reminded of my childhood. But a thought came to my mind how sounds affect us. When someone prepares a meal and watches another person eat what they have prepared the cook waits with anticipation for the sound of "mmmm that's good." The power of sound is powerful. The simple sound of the "mmm" motivates the cook to continue cooking in the future. Wow.

I thought about how people need to hear certain things. As a husband/man I like to hear my wife say that I am strong (even though I am not that strong). A woman may like to hear from her husband that she is beautiful. We all like to hear someone say "I love you," "you are appreciated," or "good job."

One day a couple of thousands years ago a man said something that changed the lives of billions of people. In English the translation of one word is broken down into three words – "It is finished!" I do not think we completely understand what this means and how it impacts the world. Sitting here trying to remember all the theology I have studied in the past 8 years I struggle for words.

You may have heard the old adage, "It's not what you say but how you say it that counts." Have you ever pondered "how" Jesus proclaimed those words? One answer is he did it with great difficulty. Bleeding from his scourging, writhing in pain from the nails, suffering from thirst, and struggling to breath from the position of his body caused the simple act of speaking to be very difficult.

Another answer is he did it with perfect authority. Jesus said in John 12:49-50 "For I have not spoken of Myself; but the Father which sent Me, He gave Me a commandment, what I should say, and what I should speak. And I know that His commandment is life everlasting: whatsoever I speak therefore, even as the Father said unto Me, so I speak." Jesus' words were not up for debate. He proclaimed the perfect truth. When Jesus cried out that "It is finished" surely it was finished, no questioned asked.

He spoke the words with perfect, selfless love for humanity. The idea of Jesus' love for people was portrayed before his crucifixion as he looked at Jerusalem and wept and as he approached Lazarus' tomb and wept. His love and concern for people was portrayed when he stopped the funeral procession and brought the widows son back to life. His love was revealed when he touched the leprous man. His love was revealed when he did not condemn the adulterous woman. His love was on display when he freed the demon possessed. His love for us is beyond our understanding. His love for us was verbalized with perfect, selfless love as he hung between heaven and earth, "it is finished!"

I look forward to seeing everyone on February 18th!


