As stated in the title of the article, social media poses to be just so... a modern counterfeit for genuine com-Satan understands our fascination munity. with this modern novelty. Conclusively, he also realizes the power it wields to influence our lives and sphere of influence. He understands the capability it has to accomplish great good for our testimony and the Kingdom of God, but counterfeits of the enemy. also instantaneously ruin that same testimony. Likewise, he wants to do everything he can to lead us to believe that things such as social

genuine, biblical relationship building in order to detract from genuine fellowship to the point of isolation. This is by no means an attempt to smear the concept or usage of social media as if it is in-



herently evil, but rather a call to introspection on the issue. Through over a decade of ministering to teenagers and their families, I have seen the consequences this social juggernaut has wrought within the culture and the family; whether innocent or intentional. However this is not an issue merely isolated to teenagers. Social Media, especially by means of the smart phone, has become the Trojan horse of the modern culture. It has steadily infiltrated almost every aspect of our lives like an anesthetic until we sober to the reality of how much we devote our time, energy, and resources to it. The Lordship of Christ would call us to evaluate our lives as to whether we are master over this issue or if it has unconsciously become master over us. It would also compel us to initiate and maintain authentic, personal relationships. Likewise it would commend us to seek wisdom to discern at what frequency and with what character we participate in social media: setting appropriate limits and standards by which we conduct ourselves. Conclusively, let us then resolve to use this "tool" of our modern culture as a testimony to reach the culture for the glory of God, and gain wisdom to discern through the
