From The Pastor

The United States elected a new president and many have rejoiced and many have rebelled. The nation has divided in many ways. It is a tenuous time politically. Yet we must remember that the Lord is sovereign over His creation and He has a plan. I believe it is crucial for every Christian to remember the following scriptures.

First, we are told in 1 Timothy 2:1-4

"1 First of all, then, I urge that entreaties and prayers, petitions and thanksgivings, be made on behalf of all men, 2 for kings and all who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. 3 This is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, 4 who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth."

Whether or not we like the new president we are to pray not only for him but also for those in places of authority.

Second, Romans 13 has some important admonitions for us:

1 Every person is to be in subjection to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those which exist are established by God. 2 Therefore whoever resists authority has opposed the ordinance of God; and they who have opposed will receive condemnation upon themselves. 3 For rulers are not a cause of fear for good behavior, but for evil. Do you want to have no fear of authority? Do what is good and you will have praise from the same; 4 for it is a minister of God to you for good. But if you do what is evil, be afraid; for it does not bear the sword for nothing; for it is a minister of God, an avenger who

brings wrath on the one who practices evil. 5 Therefore it is necessary to be in subjection, not only because of wrath, but also for conscience' sake. 6 For because of this you also pay taxes, for rulers are servants of God, devoting themselves to this very thing. 7 Render to all what is due them: tax to whom tax is due; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honor to whom honor.

Violent protests against the leadership is not godly. King David gives us a good example to follow as he would not harm the king because he knew that the king was God's anointed. King Saul failed but it was not David's place to take Saul's life; Saul's life was in God's hands. We are to honor the office whether we like or dislike the person seated there.

Third, I believe Jude has some strong input into the conversation.

8 Yet in the same way these men, also by dreaming, defile the flesh, and reject authority, and revile angelic majesties. 9 But Michael the archangel, when he disputed with the devil and argued about the body of Moses, did not dare pronounce against him a railing judgment, but said, "The Lord rebuke you!" 10 But these men revile the things which they do not understand; and the things which they know by instinct, like unreasoning animals, by these things they are destroyed.

A person that rejects authority invites trouble to themselves. The angels understand this and follow the guide lines of authority.

Lastly, let us understand what Proverbs 21:1 tells us.

1 The king's heart is like channels of water in the hand of the LORD: He turns it wherever He wishes.

Those in leadership are not there by mistake nor are they alone. The Lord guides them to accomplish His task and this is confirmed in the prophets of the Old Testament. All of these combined should give us peace in our chaotic day, give us clear warnings about our actions and words, and show us our responsibility in the world

In the Altman family changes occurred as well. Savanna and I finished college the same year. Deana and I were blessed to be able to travel to Zambia, Africa for a life changing mission trip.

God has truly blessed our church and my family. He is surely good and gracious.

Please pray that the coming year will be a year with events that only the Lord can take credit for.
