Because he met Jesus. Jesus radically changed his perspective on the works of the flesh. Jesus revealed to Paul that no man is redeemed by the works he performs nor by his lineage. Men are redeemed and justified by the blood and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Jesus changed Paul's life. Paul was once a persecutor of the newly founded church of Jesus but he became one of the biggest promoters of the church after he learned and believed the truth.

As we begin the year of 2017 we may fondly look back at the "glory days" of our youth but may we count them as rubbish if they hinder us from promoting the Gospel of Jesus Christ. May we be sold out for Jesus and may we have a burning desire to win a lost and dying world for God's glory.


